Chairman Rick Monroe called the regular meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. He led the pledge of allegiance.

RESOLUTION #11-10-01 – Approve Minutes

Moved by Conley, second by Pavlick to approve the minutes of the September 22, 2011 regular meeting. Roll: Conley, yes; Pavlick, yes; Monroe, yes.

Visitors:

- Andy Kavc, 3054 Station Road: Thanked the trustees for the playground. He also had made the suggestion to put old tires around the electric pole at the bottom of the sledding hill. The trustees thanked him for that. Andy cut the tires to put around the pole. He also thanked North Gateway for the tires.
- Norm Hinman commented about Norwalk and Beck Roads. Rick informed him that he has been calling ODOT for repairs. He also asked about why there isn't a double yellow line on Norwalk Road. That is also up to ODOT. Norm would like to have Ken's phone number so when he's ready to burn some trees, he can give him a notice. Rick & Bill gave him dispatch's number so he could let them know also. Norm also commented on how the edges are falling apart on Beck Road.
- Andy Kavc asked about someone washing their barn floor and the manure coming off the concrete to the road. He was told to call the Health Department.
- Norm stated there were over 1,000 people who signed in at the Historical area during the Fall Foliage Tour. They also know there were several who didn't sign in so they estimate over 1,200 came through. He also said that John Barter will be the new president with Paul Peyton stepping down.
- There was discussion regarding Emil Helmer's bridge and getting help to upright it. Due to all the rain, it's not been possible to get in there.
- Rich Kroczyński, 7920 Emerald Run: The Homeowner's Association has a concern regarding deed restrictions for setback, etc. That had always been approved by the developer and signed off. Now that the developer has turned that over to them, they are concerned about the "due diligence" done by them. The prosecutor's office advises the township of what to do. The township verifies and enforces what is in our zoning code, not what is in the Homeowner's Association's deed restrictions. Rich was advised to see an attorney. He stated they are going to meet with an attorney to find out what they need to do before they have a problem. Bill was also asked to review the snow removal with Tom Croston again before winter.
- Andy Kavc asked if we had a noise ordinance. He was informed that we do not.

REPORTS:

Zoning:

- Dorothy Crouch was present after a 2 month illness and welcomed back.
- Someone from Wayne County asked about park dedication pictures. The reporter, Allison Wood, of The Post will forward him pictures.
- Keith from Shale Creek called regarding a waterline leak in his front yard.
- There were several trick or treat phone calls in the past couple of days that weren't happy regarding the last minute announcement of trick or treat for the township.

Fire Department:

- Chief Ken Barrett left a copy of last month's run report and his report for the trustees due to his absence for work. (Attached Item A)

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- Ken recommended that Shelly Stauffer be returned from her leave of absence and put back on active status.

RESOLUTION #11-10-02 – Return to Active Status for Shelly Stauffer

Moved by Conley, second by Pavlick to return Shelly Stauffer to active status effective November 1, 2011. Roll: Conley, yes; Pavlick, yes; Monroe, yes.

RESOLUTION #11-10-03 – Purchase of Washer and Dryer

Moved by Conley, second by Monroe to approve the new washer and dryer from Belenky for \$11,875.00. Roll: Conley, yes; Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes.

RESOLUTION #11-10-04 – Approve Ron Pfaff for the Electric Upgrade

Moved by Monroe, second by Conley to approve Ron Pfaff for the electric upgrade on the washer and dryer. Roll: Monroe, yes; Conley, yes; Pavlick, yes.

Trustees:

Bill Pavlick:

- Bill gave a recap of Issue 2 and cited several discrepancies in the ads and what the Governor wants to do with SB 5. Bill asked that a resolution be passed to support public employees and urge everyone to vote no for Issue 2. There was then discussion on how in the past we've turned down other requests for support of levies or issues and if this is passed, then it would be hard to turn down future requests. Bill then made the following motion.

RESOLUTION #11-10-05 – Support for Public Employees

Moved by Pavlick, second by Conley to support public employees in the state of Ohio. Roll: Pavlick, yes; Conley, yes; Monroe, yes.

- Colene and I attended a meeting at the sheriff's office regarding dispatch services with narrow banding. The cost to the County to upgrade will be \$45,451. All radios will need to be compatible. We're lucky in that ours can be programmed to be compatible. There was also discussion on radio etiquette and the keying so that people can't communicate.
- The sign for the park is in but is not ready to be picked up yet. Ken Neumeyer will install it and the utilities have been marked.
- I also attended a fracking seminar. It is a growing field and looks to be growing quickly. If one of these companies has a spill, there is no telling how far the pollution would spread from the spill and water contamination. When a well is initially started, there are around 1,300 vehicles in and out. I think we should further investigate what can be done to protect our county.
- Bill gave a copy of a rendering for the cemetery sign to the trustees. I visited 7 other cemeteries for their sizes. Most are the size in the rendering. The cost is \$569 for a 2' x 42" composite sign from NorthCoast Signworks.

RESOLUTION #11-10-06 – Purchase Cemetery Sign

Moved by Pavlick, second by Conley, to purchase the Cemetery composite sign for \$569. Roll: Pavlick, yes; Conley, yes; Monroe, yes.

- Mr. Dobson has fixed a drainage issue at Emerald Run.

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- Reed Hollipeter from Medina Tractor would like to put a blue spruce tree in the park in memory of Frank Ehrman. Colene's concern was to be sure it doesn't block view from the tables toward the lake.
- Bill called Strawser regarding the Branch Road R/R tracks striping that wasn't done. Dura Mark will send Strawser a bill for that.
- I've called Justice & Co. to come look at the gap in the seam in the granite top and repair it.
- I'm working to get natural gas down Steigler Road and then will work on the remaining portion of Wolff Road. Columbia Gas won't step in until I check with all the residents for interest.

Colene Conley:

- We have to pass a resolution for Medina City for the Brownsfield Grant. They got the \$1 million and would like to begin spending it.
- There was a dark spot on Marks Road near Mike Sweet's house and another at the colonial further down. Ohio Edison will set a pole on our side and Medina's side for free and charge us the monthly fee. Rick wants to see if Medina Township will cover it since there are more homes on their side than ours.

RESOLUTION #11-10-07 – Citizen of the Year Award to Paul Peyton

Moved by Conley, second by Pavlick to award the Citizen of the Year Award to Paul Peyton for all his work with the Historical Society. Roll: Conley, yes; Pavlick, yes; Monroe, yes.

- I was at the Swiss Steak Dinner accepting donations for the Park Sign. I received approximately \$140 there. Kathy Gibbons got \$13.46 from a zoning meeting and a \$500 check from Mrs. Helen Orth-Stone. Mr. Kavc also gave a \$10 donation for a total of \$663.46.
- I received a work agreement from Pendolino before Greg Dobson can do some work on Wolff Road across from the Wolff farm. Greg will be pulling out some reeds that is causing a big issue.
- I drafted 3 other work agreements for the sidewalk work that has been reviewed by Bill Thorne at the Prosecutor's Office. The Commissioners awarded the bid for the sidewalk replacement. The pre-construction meeting has not been set yet.
- On short Hamilton, a ditch was requested since the water is going down from Abbeyville. We met with a representative from the Engineer's Office and Don Dobson. Don did some work with widening the berm.
- At the end of May, Barb Grimm of 4731 Erhart had called regarding drainage issues. The Engineer's Office checked on it. They did a survey and drew up a plan. If the ditching is done and rearranged, the water can flow better. Rick will take it to Greg Dobson to see when he can do it.
- We had some trees buried along the rail trail by the park. There is a sink hole now which Don will check in the spring.
- I met with Croston, Adamsky and Harry Wetzel at Hunters Trail regarding snow plowing and their decorative mechanism at the entrance. It has been taken care of.
- We've had several phone calls regarding trick or treating. The party will be on Sunday and trick and treating will be on Monday evening.
- All striping has been completed by Dura Mark.
- Sylvia Schmidt called regarding Cemetery Road and the need for additional stone. John Porter took a load of gravel out there.

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- I picked up a card for Anita and Matt Behner. Anita's sister was the lady in Hinckley that passed away..
- I had asked Bill Thorne to send me information on the hydraulic fracking as well as Medina Twp. to forward their resolution.

RESOLUTION #11-10-08 – Preservation of Natural Resources

Moved by Conley, second by Pavlick to approve the following:

WHEREAS, the York Township Board of Trustees believes that preservation of valuable natural resources is a hallmark of a great community;

WHEREAS, ground water and natural streams contained in York Township provide valuable nutrients to our local vegetation and an aesthetically pleasing environment for our local residents;

WHEREAS, preserving these valuable hydrologic features of York Township help to ensure that residents of York Township and the greater Medina area will continue to have safe, healthy and potable drinking water for the future;

WHEREAS, regional and national companies have begun to approach residents of York Township and Medina County to secure mineral rights for natural gas and petroleum contained deep underground in the bedrock below York Township;

WHEREAS, many of these companies have proposed to extract this natural gas and petroleum by a method commonly known as hydrologic fracking;

WHEREAS, the business model of many of these companies is to remove these minerals as quickly as possible, where after they are no longer vested in the overall health of York Township or the greater Medina area;

WHEREAS, numerous nongovernmental organizations have raised serious long term environmental concerns related to the practice of hydrologic fracking, including gas being released into local groundwater and natural streams located within the immediate proximity of hydrologic fracking cities;

WHEREAS, these long term environmental concerns have not been sufficiently addressed to the satisfaction of the York Township Trustees;

WHEREAS, the York Township Board of Trustees feels the potential long term impact of hydrologic fracking unnecessarily exposes York Township residents to degradation of their natural streams and groundwater;

WHEREAS, the York Township Board of Trustees do not believe the rewards outweigh the risk; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the York Township Board of Trustees prohibits hydrologic fracking on any properties owned by York Township.

Roll: Conley, yes; Pavlick, yes; Monroe, yes.

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- I spoke with Dan Bodette, Federal Field Services, for siren inspections with a maintenance agreement.

RESOLUTION #11-10-09 – Siren Maintenance Agreement with Federal Field Services Moved by Conley, second by Pavlick to approve a maintenance agreement with Federal Field Services for the sirens at a cost of \$400 each for a total of \$2,000.00. Roll: Conley, yes; Pavlick, yes; Monroe, yes.

- There was more discussion regarding trick or treating and the fact that it has been in the paper for the 30th. The different subdivisions want different dates. It was decided to leave it on the 30th since the people will go when they want.

Rick Monroe:

- I've spoken with Matt Simons, ODOT, regarding the culvert by the park. The replacement will not be done until next year to avoid the school schedule so the buses don't have to detour all the way to SR 83.
- I contacted two different cement contractors regarding the sidewalk project for bidding. Colene stated they did not submit a bid.
- I was asked if we would be interested in putting vending machines in the park by a friend of Ron Pfaff's. Discussion included how it would be asking for vandalism issues so it was decided against it at this time.
- Ron Pfaff has been taking care of the lights over the bay doors on the station. Ron wants to experiment with a different light to see if it will last longer than the others.
- Al Lang called regarding hawks to see if he still can come to the park and go on the rail trail to let his hawks run and do some hunting. He's been doing it once a year.
- Federal Field Services came to fix the siren here at the station. It was a minor fix, fortunately for us. He worked on other townships also and went to dispatch for his report that he usually gets. From it, he found issues with the sirens on Beck and Spieth Roads also. Dispatch runs this test daily and we've not been informed of the issues. Ken Barrett will be in touch with dispatch. Rick is going to speak with Janelle at dispatch also.
- I've asked Don Dobson to fill in around the park where settling is beginning, such as the playground area. He's done a good job for us.
- I'd like to thank Ron Pfaff for donating the meat for the Swiss Steak dinner. He's done it for many years. The bill is over \$1,900.00.
- Last Thursday, at the Township Assoc. meeting, Bill Thorne spoke on several items. One of them refers to the "stupid law" – it's geared toward fire departments for trustees to charge for fire & rescue services. It's for those people who go around "high water – road closed" signs and then get stranded and need rescued. He referred the townships to their billing services for costs. Another one is for an obstruction that is built too close to the road right-of-way and it becomes a safety issue. The township can now remove it and charge the resident for that removal.
- SR 57 is falling apart and has several pot holes.
- I received a letter from John/Dorothy Silk regarding a donation from Valley City Builders to build something in memory of Frank Ehrman for the park area. I'm trying to find out what the dollar amount of the donation will be so we can move forward.
- We should have our park rule meeting. Please check your calendars and get back with me so we can set it up. We can try for November 1, 2011 at 6:00 p.m.

**RESOLUTION #11-10-15 – Brownfields Assessment Coalition
Memorandum of Agreement
Between the City of Medina, Medina Township, Montville Township,
Lafayette Township, York Township and the Village of Chippewa Lake**

Moved by Monroe, second by Pavlick to approve the following and appoint Colene Conley to represent York Township:

This Memorandum of Agreement documents the rolls and responsibilities of the various parties involved in the Assessment Coalition with regard to EPA Cooperative Agreement No. BF00E00904-0, as required per the Cooperative Agreement Terms and Conditions.

1. On June 14, 2011 EPA awarded the Cooperative Agreement to the Lead Coalition Member, the City of Medina, Ohio. The grand period is October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2014. The City of Medina is responsible to EPA for management of the cooperative agreement and compliance with the statues, regulations, and terms and conditions of the award, and ensuring that all members of the coalition are in compliance with the terms and conditions.
2. It is the responsibility of the City of Medina to provide timely information to the other coalition Partners regarding the management of the cooperative agreement and any changes that may be made to the cooperative agreement over the period of performance.
3. The Coalition Partners are Medina Township, Montville Township, Lafayette Township, York Township, and the Village of Chippewa Lake. The contact information for each of the Coalition Partners is as follows:

4. Activities funded through the cooperative agreement may include inventory preparation, site selection criteria development, assessments, planning (including

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cleanup planning) relating to brownfield sites, and outreach materials and implementation, and other eligible activities. The City of Medina may retain consultant(s) and contractors under 40 CFR 30.36 to undertake various activities funded through the cooperative agreement and may award subgrants to other coalition members under 40 CFR 31.37 for assessment projects in their geographic areas. Subgrantees are accountable to the City of Medina for proper expenditure of funds.

5. The City of Medina, as the Lead Coalition Member, will procure the consultant(s) in compliance with 40 CFR 31.36 requirements. The City of Medina will issue the Request for Qualifications and will be the entity responsible for receipt of the submitted proposals and selection and award of contracts. The City of Medina will consult with other coalition members in making selections of consultants and contractors and negotiating the terms of agreements.
6. The City of Medina, in consultation with the Coalition Partners, will work to develop a site selection process based on agreed upon factors and will ensure that a minimum of five sites are assessed over the life of the cooperative agreement, including a minimum of one site in each of the Coalition Partners jurisdictions, subject to the availability of eligible sites. Selected sites will be submitted to EPA for prior approval to ensure eligibility.
7. Upon designation of the specific sites, it will be the responsibility of the City of Medina to work with the coalition member in whose geographic area the site is located to finalize the scope of work for the consultant or contractor. It will be the responsibility of this coalition member to obtain all required permits, easements, and/or access agreements as may be necessary to undertake assessments at the selected site. If the coalition member does not have the capacity to perform these activities, the City of Medina may assist in securing necessary site access agreements and permits.
8. The City of Medina is responsible for ensuring that other activities as negotiated in the workplan, such as community outreach and involvement, are implemented in accordance with a schedule agreed upon by the City of Medina and the coalition member in whose geographic area the site to be assessed is located.

Run Response:

This month's runs are shown in the monthly run report attached.

Training:

Monday night trainings included: Emergency Room Operational changes, Mass Casualty Incident Review with Medina Hospital, Water Supply.

Activities:

This past month our Department, with the Valley City and Litchfield Departments, provided the annual Fire Prevention Day at Buckeye Elementary school, giving a little more than 1,200 students age appropriate fire prevention education. We also held our annual Swiss Steak Dinner serving 896 dinners total. Patches and the Fire Prevention Crew made an appearance at the Medina Twp. Fire Department breakfast. The Medina County Firefighters Association held their monthly meeting at our station this month with Larry Walters, Rope Rescue Coordinator, providing a review of the County All Hazards Team Rope Rescue capabilities. We have been providing, along with neighboring departments, medical standby at the home Varsity football games at Buckeye High School.

Administration:

Our 2010 FEMA AFG Grant purchasing has started with the new Turnout Gear being ordered. It is now time to purchase the washer/extractor and drying cabinet from this grant award. Attached is the quote, with costs highlighted, from Belenky for these pieces of equipment. I also have included a quote from Pfaff Electric to upgrade the breaker panel on the west wall of the truck bay and to wire new power supplies for the new washer and dryer cabinet. These costs may be covered with grant funds, I will be investigating further. I would like to ask for Trustee approval for these purchases.

Personnel:

I have spoken with Shelly Stauffer recently and she has submitted a reinstatement letter to be placed back on full active status. I have been appointed to the Medina County Career Center Public Safety Advisory Board.

Again, I apologize for not being in attendance and I thank you for the opportunity to work with, and lead, this department today and into the future.
