Trustees:

Rick Monroe:

- Smith Paving has completed the couple of minor things that needed to be finished on the Spellman/Indoe project. They will be picking up their wheel chucks from under the front tree.
- There was a tree knocked down earlier this year at the cemetery that I finally got cleaned up. It took several pickup truck loads.
- The cemetery light was not working again, but it was only the bulb this time.
- Did either of you have any culverts from the map that need repairing/replacing? I have the one on Beck Road that needs the headwalls repaired. I will get with Dan Becker at the Co. Engineer’s Office. Colene also wanted Rick to check on the culvert on Spieth Road that is the county responsibility. There is one on Spieth between Abbeyville and Hastings that needs to be looked at also as well as one on Branch Road.

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- I noticed several tires dumped on Lester Road and put them in the dumpster at the cemetery since I didn't have anywhere else to put them as well as some trash.
- We had a roundabout meeting with the school superintendent, treasurer, 2 board members and myself. The school is excited. They are looking at a fundraiser.
- I spoke with PS Fabric and Construction regarding a road they did for Medina City. I will be meeting with them to look at it to see if it would work in our parking lot.
- One of the fire dept. members spoke with Ken Barrett regarding the mulch on the west side of the station heaving and wearing at the siding. Eddie Echle has gotten Smith Brothers to donate the materials for the river gravel and fabric to replace the mulch with. We will be doing it on Saturday. The shrubs will be pulled out and dumped at Smith Brothers.

Fire Department:

- Asst. Chief Guy Roach substituted for Chief Barrett due to being called away to teach a class.
- The call summary sheet was given to the trustees.
- Training for the last month included the Fire I class; one member is in EMT training and two in medic school.
- The fire department attended the Homecoming activities and inspected the school in advance.
- The swiss steak dinner was sold out by 7:00 p.m. and netted \$6,000 for the association.
- Ken and I did a training with support staff at Buckeye last Friday.
- We had to take old 51-1 off E-bay. After 1 day, there were complaints from e-bay regarding it looking to new to be a vintage vehicle. The lights have been taken off so it can go back on.
- The Medina County Career Center 2013 Advisor of the Year was Ken Barrett.
- The SCBA bids were advertised last Thursday and today. The opening will be next Thursday. Rick asked that Bev attend the bid opening.
- Halloween will be next Thursday with the party from 6-8.
- The new 51-1 should be functional by next week since it is at Sensible Products getting the equipment mounted.
- Bill Pavlick thanked Matt Behner for organizing the swiss steak dinner. Ron Pfaff donated the meat and the paper products were also donated.
- Guy recommended that Josh Raymond be employed for the fire department.

The November 19th hearing for the McGreer case has been moved to January 2014 due to a conflict for their attorney, Mr. Jones.

Wolff Rd., TH 94	pavement has no structural problems other than a rough ride & beat up appearance – but now that major construction on the adjacent subdivision & golf course is now completed, when compared to twp's high pavement standards, a new surface course might be considered now or in near future; Rating: 3
Bachtell Rd., TH 162	good candidate for resurfacing as the most economical way to fix the list of issues that need to be addressed in near future; pavement will not totally fail if not resurfaced, but road needs some investment to avoid major repairs later; Rating: 3

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- Haury Rd., TH 172 short, problemed pavement in bad need of some kind of investment – carries little traffic, residential use; should at least repair, seal or consider single pas soft flexible moto-paver resurfacing that includes a single seal; most economical way to cover, repair & strengthen the road structure – wait much longer, it'll be just a stone alley; Rating: 5
- Lamson Ave., TH 229 west edge needs to be repaired & brought back to proper cross-section; existing pavement structure needs to be resurfaced after to strengthen road; work should be combined with that needed on Water St.; NOTE: pre-requisite work on CB along west pavement edge must be completed prior to eliminate deep hold in pavement & berm; Rating: 4
- Water St., TH 240 edge damage should be repaired; street resurfaced in its entirety to add to its structure strength; work should be combined with that needed on Lamson Ave.; Rating: 4
- Hunter's Trail, TH 624 25 mph posted; asphalt apron badly deteriorated at Wolff Road intersection; should be milled off forming a straight, neat edge along north side of Wolff Rd.; new asphalt apron installed and both edges sealed as soon as possible; Rating: 2
- Livia Lane, TH 895 25 mph posted; concrete pavement is in excellent condition. However, shoulders against pavement edges are badly eroded; in some areas to the underside of the concrete slab! Poses a major liability to twp. and will allow pavement failure if enough slap support is lost! Good clay should be added; shoulder re-graded. Rating: 1
