Chairman Todd Zieja called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and led the pledge of allegiance. Trustee Zieja stated the meeting is being recorded for transcription purposes only.

Approval of Minutes

Approval of Minutes – **Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes from April 23, 2020.** Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

RESOLUTION #20-05-01- Trustee Monroe made the motion to hire Jessie Yount, a longtime member of the Fire Department, for the position of part time maintenance crew at a rate of \$12.50 per hour. Trustee Pavlick second. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Town Hall, Zoning, Cemetery

Dorothy crouch updated the packet containing the names of all residences which have been approved for home occupancy permits in the township and gave one to each trustee.

Forest Creek Drive ADA ramps. Pulte has submitted plans and they are being reviewed. The tool trailer and porta-potty have been removed from the construction area of this development. The trailer will be gone soon to as this phase is finished. The new development on Abbeyville came to a halt because of COVID-19. Pulte hopes to start construction on June 15, 2020 if the reopening of Ohio continues to go well. The final plat will be available to be signed by the Trustees at the office. Dorothy will let them know when it is ready.

Mark's Road Barn Project – Mr. Glauner submitted his proposal to Dorothy who sent it on to the County Prosecutor for the splitting of his property into two lots, one containing the house, and one with the barn he hopes to renovate into a home. The prosecutor is not going to approve the plan as submitted and is in contact with Mr. Glauner's attorney to see if they can work on a plan that would be approved.

Brick engraving for Gold Star Memorial – Dorothy has been in contact with Midwest engraving, because many people are looking to purchase engraved stones for the memorial. Midwest gave here three names to contact to get quotes. She will also ask how often they would install them: annually, semiannually, or quarterly.

Boy Scouts are putting up the flags at the Cemetery on Saturday for Memorial Day. The new flags were put up at the township complex.

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Two of Rumpke's trash cans were left at the township complex office this week. Sarah Mathews was notified. Rumpke will determine by the codes on the can which property they came from.

Dorothy gave the large manual for the electronic sign to Trustee Zieja. Assistant Chief Jason Creamer will attend the training on the software for the electronic sign with Dorothy when Medina Signs comes out.

Trustee Pavlick

Tom Croston will start over the Memorial Day Weekend with the roadside trimming. This is the final year of the contract extension, and Mr. Croston offered to extend his service contract for an additional three years with no increase in fees. Trustee Pavlick stated this is the 13th year Croston has kept his rates unchanged. A resident stated if Mr. Croston has not increased his rates in three years, maybe the rates are too high. Mr. Pavlick said years ago the rates were based on an hourly rate, and that was subject to great fluctuations in cost. He took the proposal to the Fred Boreman, who established pricing based on mileage. This has saved the township a great deal of money. We do two mowings per year, and every third year, we add a third right of way pass. **Moved** by Trustee Pavlick, second by Trustee Monroe to extend Tom Croston Construction for an additional three years at the current pricing schedule. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Areomark – will start striping the township roads on Monday or Tuesday depending on the weather. Except for the stretch on Wolff which will be striped when it is paved, we will be paving from Stiegler to the Railroad tracks.

Trustee Zieja

Gave statistics on the impact of COVID-19. In Medina we have had 237 cases and 18 deaths. In Ohio 28,952 confirmed cases with 1,720 deaths. In the US 1.58 million cases with 93,806 deaths and 301K recovered. In the world 5 million cases, almost 2 million recovered, and 300K deaths. The governor has rescinded the stay at home orders, but cautioned the virus is still with us, and social distancing and current protocols possibly could last through 2022. Trustee Monroe stated the governor had lifted a lot of restrictions this week. Trustee Zieja urged people to check on their neighbors and be kind so we can get through this together.

Trustee Monroe

Wolff Rd Paving from RR Tracks at Columbia to Stiegler Rd will begin soon. Met with Dan Becker from the Medina County Engineer's office to discuss the project. We will hopefully have a meeting scheduled with Melway Paving in the next couple weeks. Many people have approached Trustee Monroe asking for road grindings. We cannot give the road grindings away, they are township materials, and either stay here or go back to the contractor. Buckeye School District is going to receive some of the grindings. Haury Road is in pretty bad shape. Becker and Greg Dobson went to examine it. The plan is to use 150 tons of grindings to repair the road. The highway engineer had many questions as no one has ever used grindings to fix a road. Trustee Monroe stated we use grindings in the parking lot, and it has a great deal of traffic and holds up well. He

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is confident it will hold up on Haury. Greg Dobson will have equipment. It will probably be six tandem dump truck loads. Discussion ensued about alternative methods to place grindings into road repairs. Prior to starting the paving, we need to repair two culverts on Wolff Rd. Dobson thinks it will only take one day if all goes well. Dorothy will take care of ad in paper.

RESOLUTION #20-05-03 Closing Wolff Rd from Columbia Road to Stiegler Road for Dobson Excavating to repair culverts from May 27, 2020 until project complete. Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick . Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Gold Star Memorial- the new stone to replace the vandalized stone has been set. We pushed to have everything completed before Memorial Day. It took a few supplies and a whole day of work, but it really looks nice.

Lester Rd Siren – has been inspected and repaired. It had been corroded, but everything is fixed and working properly.

Cemetery Grant Update – We had submitted a grant for \$93K to be used to repair the driveway in the cemetery and increase handicap parking. Trustee Monroe attended the meeting, however we were not awarded the grant. This is the second time we were not successful in a funding request.

Station Road is Flooding – Greg Dobson informed Trustee Monroe that Station Road is flooding. There is a box culvert with a flat top catch basin here. After raking off leaves and debris, it does work again. This is not the first time this area has flooded due to this style basin. Trustee Monroe contacted Andy Conrad at the Engineer's office about putting a Beehive cone catch basin in place of the flat style. Andy agreed.

Fascia on fire complex that was damaged in the tornado/storm in April was repaired by RAD Construction.

Playground – The lady bug reinstallation, the crack in the climbing wall and other playground repairs have been done by Snider Recreation Construction. The playground is still not available for play due to the COVID 19 restrictions.

Weed Pro reseeded the skating rink area, however nothing came up. Trustee Monroe called and they will repeat the work.

National EMS Week – Trustee Monroe wanted to thank our Fire Department/EMS for exemplary work. They do a lot for the township and he is grateful. He shared the EMS week motto: "EMS Strong. Plan for Tomorrow."

Fiscal Officer

Local Government Receipts have ranged from \$3 - \$4K each month until April which is \$2558. This revenue stream is likely to go even lower, and we will be keeping an eye on it.

Armstrong- Internet usage – the internet usage for the township resets on or about the 4th of each month. Nearly every month I receive a text/email alerting me to the fact our internet usage is about to be exceeded. **“Internet usage has reached 92%. As of 05/04/2020, you have used 952 GB. You are 30 days into your billing period. Internet usage that exceeds your allocation in a billing period will be charged at a rate of \$100 per 500 GB.”**

The Historical Society wanted access to the internet for their meetings. I told Janice Calame when she asked this might push us over the limit and we would need to discuss with the trustees if they would approve access and if we should increase our usage limits. The consensus is there is no network service at the town hall, so it will not be possible for the historical society to utilize the internet. Dorothy had already informed them of this information.

Motion to Accept Armstrong Cable Franchise Fees for 1st quarter 2020 of \$6056.03. Moved by Trustee Pavlick, second by Trustee Monroe. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

After speaking with Trustee Monroe, I asked why Frontier did not pay us a franchise fee. He stated they should, so we will work on changing that. He also informed us the current rate for

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franchise fee payment to the township is 3%. We are able to increase that to 5%. Trustee Monroe will draft a letter informing the cable providers of the new policy.

RESOLUTION #20-05-06 to increase franchise fee for cable providers within the township from 3% to 5%.). Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick
Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Motion to Accept Ohio Bureau of Worker’s Compensation Refund of \$19,565.62 to ease the financial pressures our organization may be experiencing amid the COVID-19 Pandemic.

This check is ours to spend as we wish, but Gov. DeWine’s hope is we use this money to invest in the health and safety of our employees. \$3,130.50 to General Fund, \$16,435.12 to the Fire Fund, reflecting the percentages we pay into the premium. Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

UAN Fee Holiday- From Keith Faber:

“The COVID-19 pandemic is expected to impact the immediate budgets of local governments for an extended period of time. Ohio’s heavy reliance on income and sales taxes have taken a substantial hit from the economic shut down as we have responded to the virus. In a time when every dollar is critical, we must work together to find any and all cost saving opportunities.

The Auditor’s office will waive the UAN User Fee and Hardware Surcharge for the third quarter of 2020 (July – September). Historically, UAN provides a fee holiday soon after a hardware purchase is completed. However, we are accelerating this waiver of fees in an effort to assist our clients during these trying financial times prior to the completion of the computer refresh that is planned for later this year.” We pay \$876 per quarter.

Mrs. James Stahl Sr. of Beck Road called me on May 6, 2020. She tried each trustee, but no one answered. She thinks maybe they are afraid. After receiving the letter from the trustees informing her household they were not excused from trash service and must participate or have delinquent bills certified to the auditor, she called Rumpke. She spoke with a very nice customer service representative. As of May 1, 2020 her residence is signed up for service. Even though they have not utilized trash service for many years, a neighbor told her it was actually a good deal. She signed up for full service. If she has to be part of this, she might as well clean out extra items. She was informed by Rumpke she will only be billed for service starting in May going forward. She is also taking the necessary steps to have a medical pick up since her husband is 85, and she is 79. Their driveway is approximately 50’, so it should not be a problem. She wanted to be assured that by doing these steps, and paying for service in a timely manner, they would not have any trouble with trash pick up going on their tax bill. I informed her participation and timely payment will keep her residence in good standing.

Mr. David Borling called. He had talked to Trustee Pavlick about the house on Stone he purchased and is rehabilitating. It is vacant. Later the home will need trash service, but not while he is fixing it up. This address was never listed on the vacant house list, and received a bill. (In

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correspondence). I called and spoke with Sarah Mathews. She said once we put it on the vacant house list Rumpke would adjust the balance on his bill and he would not owe anything.

Gina McVetta called because she received a letter from the trustees stating their house refused rubbish. This is incorrect. She contacted Rumpke, who confirmed her account is active. She is happy with the trash service, and would like her name removed from the noncompliant list. The list came from Solid Waste.

Grindstone Landscape Supply sent us an invoice for topsoil. After calling the number it was determined that Fabrizi Trucking is responsible for repairs for damage caused by snowplow which we are not responsible for so they will void for York and send to Fabrizi.

Old Business: Looking back over the past year's minutes, the following items need further discussion.

Cameras for Park Quote- Trustee Zieja stated he found a company who came out to look at the set up, but he has not been able to secure a quote from them. He has called several times but was disappointed at not receiving the courtesy of a return call, and no quote or follow-up has been forthcoming from this business. Trustee Pavlick said he would try and get a quote from lighthouse.

KLM our risk assessment strategist from OTARMA suggested we implement inspection logs for roads, sign inspection, and park. Trustee Monroe stated we just fixed the park wasn't that good enough. I thought the purpose of the logs was so the township could demonstrate maintenance and awareness of problems. Therefore if any incident occurred where someone might try and blame the township for negligence we would have documentation to support regular inspections and awareness of the condition of these items entrusted to us. In addition she requested that we have a township contract for the contractors. In a previous meeting, the Trustees stated that the only area they felt needed a contract was lawn maintenance. At that time Trustee Pavlick was going to contact Fred Boreman or the prosecutor to see if we could get a contract for this situation. Today he wondered if the award of the bid was not sufficient for this purpose. Trustee Zieja wanted to know if there were samples. Yes, they were given months ago, which is why we are bringing it up again since they have not been implemented yet. Just trying to clean up old business.

Parks Levy Fall – Were we still planning to place the Park's .5 renewal levy on the fall ballot? This would be a renewal levy, not costing residents any additional tax money.

RESOLUTION #20-05-07 Moved by Trustee Monroe to approve contacting the prosecutor to start the process for placement of a renewal five year, .5 (1/2) mil parks levy on the fall 2020 ballot. Second by Trustee Pavlick Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Chief Barrett explained that when a levy is approved, the dollar amount it collects does not change over the years, no matter how housing increases or decrease. The amount on individual taxes is adjusted to meet the approved amount. What this means is as new housing comes into

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the township, the additional tax revenue does not increase the funds unless we vote a replacement levy or an increase. The township is only a small percentage of resident's property tax. The schools get the largest share of property taxes.

Ally Wingfield – Has not submitted a reimbursement. Trustee Pavlick will check it with her.

Fire Department –

Chief Barrett began by rehiring Patrick Barrett. He needed to separate from the department for 3 months to fulfill a pension transfer. He is eligible to be rehired at this time.

RESOLUTION #20-05-08 Re-Hire Patrick Barrett for Firefighter/EMT and Reinstate as Officer - Lieutenant. Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick . Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Chief Barret would also like to hire two additional firefighter/EMT candidates. They have been waiting since March to become part of the department. Hiring has been frozen due to COVID-19. Mr. Gagne has no experience, but he has a desire to be trained and serve the community. Mr. Bromley has been a member of the Medina Township Fire Department as a firefighter/EMT for many years.

RESOLUTION #20-05-09 Hire Brodie Gagne for Firefighter/EMT. Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick . Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes. Trustee Monroe did the swearing in.

RESOLUTION #20-05-10 Hire Gary Bromley for Firefighter/EMT. Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick . Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes. Trustee Monroe did the swearing in.

Chief Barrett went over the monthly report. We had 13 runs, with 79% being transported. In the township we have not had a huge rise in COVID-19 cases. To comply with the state mandates regarding classroom gatherings, training has been modified for the past 2 months. Twice per week department members gathered to do deep cleaning and disinfecting of all equipment and the station. We have purchased equipment in the last month The entire back of the squad has been steamed with a Clorox mist. We will continue to go above and beyond to ensure safety. We have access through the fire academy for online classes that will count towards education requirements for members needing hours. This will remain in effect even after restrictions lift June 1, 2020. We will resume training in June, but be able to take advantage of airflow by conducting classes outside.

We have submitted applications for several grants:

1. AFG Grant for new 700 megahertz pointers for \$25,000.
2. AFG Grant for COVID-19 additional funds not covered by the Medicare Grant
3. COVID -19 SCBA mask with filtration for N95 masks with fixed permanent eye shield,

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4. Annual State EMS Grant. Last year we got \$3K.

We were approached by Captain Josh Noftz at Lafayette Twp. along with Seville, Westfield, Lodi, and Chatham to make a group purchase of an SCBA and other mask fit tester. The total cost of the unit 17,134.41. TSI will add in the Scott adapter at no charge. That total includes the 5 year warranty. The warranty covers factory clean and calibration, TSI would pay the shipping cost for maintenance, and guarantees our unit would be fast tracked for service. The warranty is normally 2 years, they have extended it to 5.

Each department would be responsible for \$2,855.74 and would get 2 months out of the year to have the device.

This unit is compliant with the new OSHA standards for fit testing. The tests are 2.29 minutes long as opposed to the old 7 minute test. This machine will do all half face masks, N95s, SCBAs, etc. The software can be uploaded to as many computers as we want. No need for a separate laptop.

If all departments go in the cost would only be \$2,855.74. As seen below this includes the fit tester and 5 year warranty/ service. This would pay for itself in three years or less if we had to contract this service out. Fit testing has been on our mind for some time and is actually one of the few state required things for FD. **Moved by Trustee Monroe to approve \$2,855.74 for a group purchase of SCBA fit tester** second by Trustee Pavlick Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

MARCS Grant – We are going to purchase 11 Radios, 11 Heavy duty microphones, 11 chargers, 3 bank charges for the station. For \$50,586.47 We have chosen to also purchase an additional radio in addition to the grant (\$48,994.63) for a cost of \$1,600.00. (normally \$3,400.00) In addition, we need a feature P25 Phase 2 TDMA service fee of \$185 per radio totaling \$2,200. We will receive a trade in credit for our MBP radios which will offset this cost, therefore reducing the total to 0. State Fire Marshall only allows to follow state guidelines. These will only be on the 700 radio band.

RESOLUTION #20-05-11 To purchase from Cleveland Communications 12 radios, 11 heavy duty mics, 11 chargers, and 3 bank chargers to a total of \$50,586.47. Grant award \$48,994.63, remainder \$1,591.84 from Fire Equipment. Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Public Comment:

Keith Hinman – Beck Rd. 1. Thanked Trustee Monroe for coming out for a dispute they had in the neighborhood the other day. 2. Was anyone aware of the missing guardrail on Stone, east of Beck on the north side of the street near the hilly section. There was an accident which folded a portion of the guard rail where a vehicle left the road. 3. Inquired about lowering the speed limit on Beck Road. Beck Road has no speed limit signs posted. In the absence of a sign, the law states

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the speed limit is 55 mph. People are flying down the road, not slowing down for hidden drives.
4. If Croston has not raised his prices, he charges too much. Trustees stated that he has a competitive bid, and many times he is the only bidder. The county engineer wrote up specs for the mowing. We pay \$9400 approximately per mowing and every third year we do a third pass.

Laura Dash – Columbia Rd. Wanted to know what possessed the trustees to do the trash. Trustee Pavlick stated we are the fourth township to go through this process. We have significantly reduced the amount most residents were paying for trash. We had four different haulers coming in the township on four different days. By going with a single hauler we could try and reduce wear and tear on the roads. Mrs. Dash still feels there is a lot of traffic. The part that bothers her is there was no notification, one day she woke up and there were two trash cans in her driveway. Many people are unhappy with this situation. She feels Rumpke does not do a very good job as she thinks there is more trash in the ditches than ever. Her garbage was full to the top with pop cans, half ended up in the neighbors yard, half still in the can. The old service provider at least cared. She knows some of the trustees really well, and cannot understand how they did this to the township.

Mike Izzo Speith Rd.– Asked Trustee Zieja how it felt to be repeatedly ignored when asking for information (in reference to Zieja's comment about not receiving any response from a vendor despite repeated inquiries to submit a bid for cameras.) Mr. Izzo wanted to know how it felt, as he had been experiencing a similar situation in trying to communicate with the trustees. He has been calling, emailing and not getting any responses. Trustee Monroe stated he called him back. Trustee Pavlick also stated he called him back when he returned from vacation. Trustee Zieja did not call back, but returned emails as he has limited time and is able to respond to emails after midnight, when most people would not appreciate a phone call. Mr. Izzo has been taking his garbage to his place of business for 19 years. He also wondered why there will be no spring cleanup this year? What has changed? Trustee Pavlick stated the township has relied on the County Jail to provide prisoners to assist with township clean up and due to COVID19 the sheriff will not permit the inmates to help with any township cleanups this year. Also the unlimited contract with Rumpke has 2 cubic yards of waste allowed in addition to the cans every single week. This should be sufficient for all the waste a household produces. It cost the township over \$4,000 to do a spring cleanup. The trustees will discuss in the coming years if it would be a good use of resources to also pay for a township cleanup day since unlimited trash pick up is available at most households.

Donna Surmitis – Smith Rd. Due to traveling, Mrs. Surmitis was not aware of the trash hauling situation. It was a surprise to her when she came home and found two trash cans in her yard. She and her husband are elderly and not in good health. Their driveway is longer than 150 feet, and even with the medical exemption, they struggle to get the cans to the appropriate place for pickup. It is hard to get medical forms filled out during this COVID19 season. The cans are too heavy, and there is trash left in the cans and on the roadside. Trustee Zieja stated he voted for the majority, but Mrs. Surmitis said the majority are millennials and live in developments having shorter driveways. They did not consider the older township folks living in the country. She is accustomed to burning her trash and did not need service. Fire Chief Barrett stated the Ohio Fire Code states the only item permissible to burn is dried, seasoned wood. He also informed her that anyone caught

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burning trash can be fined by the EPA. She has another property in another county that she has taken trash to in the past where she already pays for service. She understands many people in the township benefit from this contract, but she thinks it would have been better to have the township decide about the trash by voting. Trustee Pavlick stated no other township voted. As elected officials they have the discretion to provide this service. Information about all township meetings has been in the Gazette as required by ORC. No other township exceeded 3% opt out. By doubling the optout to 6% we thought that would be sufficient.

Andy Kavc – Thanked Trustee Zieja for giving him the public record optout list. He felt the names listed represented the good old boys and political clout of the township. He did not agree with the way the time stamp was verified for all these names. Next year he would like to see each submission with a verifiable time stamp. Trustee Zieja said he would do what it takes to certify time stamps on submissions for next year.

Amy Missler – Columbia Rd. We were supposed to be given a voucher for \$5 off per ton. Trustee Pavlick stated they are available at the township office and will be good until the middle of July, Residents can use this to take large loads to the processing facility. Trustee were asked why township cleanup cost so much if we used volunteers. Trustee Pavlick responded only the prisoner's time was donated. We used to pay C.Martin for the dumpsters and hauling. We paid Central Processing for each load, and Greg Dobson for his assistance.

Norm Hinman – Beck Rd. Submitted a list of questions (attached) for Trustee Zieja to answer, either at the next meeting, or prior to meeting in an email. Norm thinks the website is subpar. The new electric board does not have information. The trash traffic is currently the same as before the contract. Four trucks made trips down the road. Currently each truck (regular and recycling) makes two passes down the road since the arms of the truck only pick up one side at a time. There are still four trips per week on his road. If they miss a can, they send another truck, which has happened twice before.

Asked if anyone had been hired to do the township mowing. Trustee Monroe stated Blade to Blade was the low bidder in 2019 for the lawn maintenance. We advertised the bid according to the law.

Keith Hinman – Asked if we took care of the roads in the Emerald Woods, and Shale Creek? If they are public roads we take care of them. Some of the roads in these developments are private roads and we do not have to care for them.

Dave Hull Speith Rd. In the Rumpke contract, they are supposed to be fined if they do not do a pick up. He wondered what the processes for that? Trustee Pavlick said the requirement is to have the trash out at the road the prior night. If the trash is not there when trucks pick up it will not be done until the following week. 6am is the starting time for trash pick up in the township. Fuel prices are readjusted quarterly.

Chief Barrett – Columbia Gas Transmission and Columbia Gas are two separate companies. Columbia Gas Transmission bought out by TC Energy, so they would have a pipeline running from Mexico to Canada. They are no longer going to maintain the storage wells of natural gas

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around the township, and they are trying to kick everyone off the wells, shut them down, plug the well and move everyone to paid subscriptions to the gas line. Attorneys will be hired to prevent this from happening.


