Chairman Todd Zieja called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and led the pledge of allegiance. Trustee Zieja stated the meeting is being recorded for transcription purposes only.

Approval of Minutes

Approval of Minutes – **Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes for May 21, 2020.** Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Fire Department –

Chief Ken Barrett submitted the monthly report totaling 21 runs for the month with one vehicle fire. He has not heard anything on the grants we have applied for.

Cleveland Communications was unable to fill the quote for radios. Since last meeting, the fire department has had to find another vendor for the equipment.

RESOLUTION #20-06-01 Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick to to Rescind RESOLUTION #20-05-11 To purchase from Cleveland Communications 12 radios, 11 heavy duty mics, 11 chargers, and 3 bank chargers to a total of \$50,586.47. Grant award \$48,994.63, remainder \$1,591.84 from Fire Equipment. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes

Assistant Chief Jason Creamer has been working with other townships in the county, the Fire Marshall, and the following vendors and submits the following proposal to upgrade the York Erhart Fire Department to the MARCS Statewide Radio Network. We will be donating one of the radios to dispatch. We are not able to use this grant to update the radio service fees for the radios we already own. We can only use it for the new radios. However we are able to apply next year for a grant that will cover all radio user fees.

RESOLUTION #20-06-02

Motion by Trustee Monroe To purchase using the Funds from the MARCS Grant in Fund 2901 of \$48,994.63 and Funds from the Fire Department Fund 2191 of \$5,167.26 for the following:

13 Radios, Microphones, Bank Chargers, Vehicle Chargers, Vehicle Power Kits; 16 Knob Covers and 1 Mobile Radio w/ Accessories from Cleveland Communications for \$17,411.89;

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56 Radio service fees from OHIO DAS totaling \$6,720.00;

13 Portable Radio Units, Antenna, Shoulder Microphone, Batteries, Chargers and Programming/Installation from VASU Communications, INC. for \$30,030.00.

Total Purchase \$54,161.89 to be paid for as follows: From MARCS Grant in Fund 2901 - \$47,434.63 for Radio Equipment; From MARCS Grant in Fund 2901- \$1560.00 for Annual Services Fees for New Radio Equipment. (Total for MARCS Grant \$48,994.63). Remaining \$5,167.26 for balance of equipment and to service Radios already in inventory will come from the Fire Fund 2191.

Second by Trustee Pavlick. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Town Hall, Zoning, Cemetery-

Lagerheads on Abbeyville Rd. needs a letter stating the township gives temporary permission for them to use the patio area on the west side of the building for outdoor serving. The letter is required for the State Liquor Agency. Dorothy typed a letter if the Trustees would like to give their permission. They did sign and Dorothy will get it to the owners.

Dorothy advised Pulte Homes they still owed \$1610 for consultation Fees for Steingass Estates and Mr. O'Connor has taken care of that.

The final plat for the Steingass Estates is signed and returned to Mr. O'Connor. The last page did not show the emergency drive through the original farmhouse. Mr. O'Connor brought a corrected page and it was placed in the final plat so it was correct.

There are several decks and porch roofs on Arapaho Way that were put in with out permits. Letters will be sent.

3028 Pioneer Rd had some barn additions and a pool deck put on with out permits. Contacted property owners and they came in right away and took care of it.

7125 Elyria Rd. Person contacted us to put in an auto salvage. Not a permitted use. There was portable office on the property which had to be removed. There were still trailers on the property owned by Trailer One. There has been no approval for this business. They came for a site review and never came back to finished it. They have since moved the trailers. There are several concrete truck parts to be moved off the property yet.

The BZA will hear a variance on 6/30/20 on a house remodel Wolff Rd. The variance request is for a house setback of 94 feet instead of the required 100 feet. Trustees were given paperwork and went over the request.

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Dorothy passed out literature on tree planting, the proper procedure for caring for trees and extending their life. It was sent from Medina Co. Soil and Water.

Greg Glauner is still trying to split his lot on Marks Rd. He wants redo the barn into a home.

Mr. Rose on Emerald Run was told in the past there was a riparian buffer in part of his property. He is interested in building a barn on his property. He has spoken to Matt Martin and was told there is no riparian buffer there. Before we issue a permit, we will need a letter from the County.

Trustees :

Trustee Monroe –

Certified Pest Control sprayed for bees and wasps on June 2, 2020 at the Historical Society, Town Hall, Fire Complex and Community Playground. The guarantee is no bees or wasps for six months.

Wolff Rd. Culvert Repairs – We ended up repairing 3 culverts. Much of the gravel washed away in the rain, so many complaints came in from people the county put up “BUMP” signs at each location. One sign has already been stolen.

Abbeyville – The County Engineer will be doing a lot of work On Abbeyville because they are going to pave between Fenn and Wolff. We will try and coordinate so both Wolff and Abbeyville Roads are not shut down at the same time.

Wolff Rd.- Dan Becker gave an estimate for repairs to Wolff from Stiegler to Abbeyville. Becker reported over \$11,000 in repairs to culverts etc. just on the North side of the road. Trustee Monroe said we do not have the funds at this time, so no need to even look at the south side of the road at this time.

Trustee Monroe spoke with Andy Conrad. The county replaced the catch basin on Spieth from last month. The guardrail on the 5600 block on Wolff Rd. is on the list to be replaced. Conrad agreed something needs to be done. Since the entire 80 year old bridge at this location is on the list to be replaced sometime over the next five years, they will replace the guardrail at that time.

Spieth – Just west of the RR Tracks is a concrete culvert that is 85 years old. It is coming apart where they butt together and also on the county list to replace.

Light at 18 & 57 – Julie Cichello is in charge of the light. Trustee has left messages with her about the timing of the light since traffic backs up on 18 all the way to Fenn. He will follow up with email until this is fixed.

EMA Office – Trustee Monroe thanked them for doing the work to obtain a grant to purchase masks from the State of Ohio for township employees. He picked them up several weeks ago.

Fix it Funds – for a home valued at \$250 there are funds available for repairs at 2.5% below interest rates.

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Weed Pro – Trustee Monroe spoke with Mike Sweet about the ice rink seeding. Sweet said give it some time. If the grass does not grow, Weed Pro will reseed.

Ohio Edison Helicopter – Trustee Monroe gave permission for the helicopter to park in the old York School house lot. Follow up: The helicopter has completed inspections on 7200 miles of high voltage lines. They look for damaged crossbars, insulators, hardware problems, anything you can't see from the ground. They also fix items as they see them. Inspections of transformers and insulation taking place since there is more demand for electricity due to more people at home due to COVID-19.

Fireworks – Many reports of noise complaints. More people setting off fireworks from morning until night, during the week and weekends. National news also reports as an increasing problem. The Chief stated amateur fireworks displays will continue to increase since Ohio is in the process of approving Class C fireworks for public use.

Shooting – Received three calls on shooting in the township. He refers complaints to the website for rule, and states if rules are violated, call the Sherriff's office. If the dispatch is not responsive, call Sherriff Tom Miller directly.

Trustee Pavlick –

Road side mowing is complete. John Kollar finished all the weedwacking.

Road striping started with yellow center lines. White lines should be painted in the upcoming week. Fiscal Officer Russell stated she did not think Erhart had been striped.

I2C Technology- Looking into quote for security cameras for park and an upgrade for the Fire Department. Trustee Pavlick also applied for a 50/50 matching grant for the cameras. He will hear about the results later, COVID 19 has disrupted the process.

Since Kasich took township roads money to pave the roads, we have not been able to replace the funding. We used to be proactive in upkeep and repair of roads, now we are forced to be reactive. The spring levy on the March Ballot for roads did not pass. We are eligible for a \$5 plate fee that will be used to fund road and bridge maintenance. **Moved by Trustee Pavlick, second by Trustee Monroe to start the process of the additional license permissive tax.**
Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

Richard Hill asked if we had a Road and Bridge Fund. We do, but it is funded through the general fund. We are one of about three townships that do not have a Roads Levy.

Trustee Zieja

Gave statistics on the impact of COVID-19. In Medina, we have had 441 cases and 31 deaths. In Ohio 45,274 confirmed cases with 2,704 deaths. In the US 2.4 million cases with 120,809 deaths. In the world 9.4 million cases, and 474K deaths. Trustee Zieja knows the Governor urges use of

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masks and social distancing. He see the numbers go up and down; we still have work to do. 31 people is too many people to lose in Medina. Trustee Zieja urged people to check on their neighbors and be kind so we can get through this together.

Trustee Zieja looked into a sound system to address the complaints from residents they cannot hear. He saw one at Walmart for \$50 he did not feel would meet our needs, and saw a sound system for \$4,000. He feels this might be unnecessarily expensive for the township to justify. He will try and do more research to find a solution to people not being able hear.

Blade to Blade monthly bill includes the mulch labor, bush trimming and weed pulling for Memorial Day. There were two weeks where twice a week mowing was necessary. **Motion to Approve Blade to Blade for monthly mowing for two weeks in May and 4 weeks in June totaling \$5,767.50. Moved** by Trustee Pavlick, second by Trustee Monroe. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.

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A resident complained about the hit or miss mowing on Stone Rd. Another resident said he thought the person doing the mowing did a fine job, but felt the blades could be sharpened before service provided.

When Greg Dobson started the repairs for two culverts, it was discovered a third culvert needed replaced.

NEXUS Appeal – Mary Beth Gunther emailed to let all the townships and school districts know that NEXUS has appealed their values for a third time. Their newest appeal is 38% of the original value. They tendered paid 47% of their original value the first half. She will let us know what percentage they will pay in the 2nd half. Ray Ruprecht has had communication with Cloverleaf School Superintendent Daryl Kubilus about the possibility of government entities joining a coalition of schools that are coming together to appeal to the Ohio Tax Commissioner about the NEXUS appeals'. He does not know the current status of the schools that were looking at forming this coalition and if they are interested in including government entities, but is certainly something to consider as we deal with these incredible reductions. Mike Kovack responded that county auditors can only become involved after the state has ruled the appeal. It is a statewide issue and one that county auditors have been following closely, together, in meetings in Columbus. There has been much discussion of having a joint effort once we find out what the state does with the NEXUS appeal. The problem with the situation is we have zero expertise on the valuation of pipelines because it is done entirely by the state. It means any appeal will

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involve the employ of out of state specialty appraisers, which makes consolidating appeals attractive and cost effective. He will keep us informed as he receives information from the state.

Public Comment

Donna Surmitis – Has filled out multiple forms, dated months ago and had many conversations with Rumpke about her family's medical exemption. She did get trustee approval, and trash pickup started, was interrupted. Because the procedure stated in the contract had not been followed correctly, there was some confusion with this particular case. Trustee Zieja stated Rumpke placed the responsibility for incorrect paperwork procedure on him. Dorothy contacted Rumpke, Sarah Mathews, and the route supervisor and then followed the recommended procedure for the Surmitis family and this should be resolved. Dave Hull suggested that we fine Rumpke for inability to provide services. Trustee Pavlick said there was no need to fine Rumpke since the proper procedures had not been followed.

Terry Gerspacher – As the representative for the south end of Medina, he wondered why the minutes were not posted following the meeting. Fiscal Officer Russell responded she did post the April minutes following the May meeting. She contacted tech help to find the reason they did not appear on the public side of the site. He gave her additional instructions to go to Word Press and flush the cache. This will hopefully resolve the issue in the future. Fiscal Officer Russell apologized, website management is not one of her strengths.

PPE is being littered in the ditches. Trustee Monroe says that is a problem everywhere, parking lots etc.

Stone & Columbia- the white line is painted too close to the stop sign.

Dave Hull – regarding the Rumpke Issue, wondered why if Rumpke is not meeting the requirements of the contract are they not being fined? Trustee Pavlick stated they are meeting the terms of the contract. We need to follow the protocol stated.

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Abbeyville Rd.

Pulte – Mr. Hull wondered about the Pulte's request and the recommendation to recuse Dave Hull from the zoning commission board. The trustees are not going to take any action at this time.

SR 57 & Spieth- the roundabout drainage system. Trustee Monroe spoke to Bob Weaver, and the job is still scheduled to be bid in March and awarded in June to install 36" storm drain.

Lynn Kemp – Thanked board for filling the culvert bumps with additional stone. She also wanted the board to know how happy she is with the new trash service. She appreciates less traffic on the road, the opportunity to recycle at the curbside. She also wanted to let people know that if there were people who need assistance due to the COVID 19 pandemic, she would be happy to assist.

Sandra Thomas Feign – In February her mailbox was knocked down by the snow plow. She had been told that because it was rusted they are not going replace it. She stated it was still able to collect mail, it was not able to collect mail because they knocked it down. Trustee Monroe will look into it.

Keith Hinman – Was anything done about the speed limit on Beck yet? Nothing yet. Can anyone work on the electric sign out front? We will set up training with Medina sign. Has anything been done about the guardrail on Stone? Trustee Monroe stated the county is responsible for guardrails and will take care of it.

Kathy Szdanko – 1. Has had to listen to neighbors shoot for 5 hours at a time, rapid-fire guns. Is there any way to limit shooting in the township? Why do neighbors have to be subject to this much noise? It limits the time she is able to enjoy her property.

Keith Hinman stated the shooter is responsible for everything that leaves the barrel of your gun. The shooting range behind the weigh station is not well monitored by the city either.

2. There is no speed limit on Stiegler Rd. Motorcycles ride up and down the road because it is a straight shot. Trustee Zieja asked what time does this typically happen – 6:30 - 8:30pm weekends. He will request the Sheriff monitor with extra patrols during these times.

Richard Hill – stated that he is surprised we do not use a contractor who has the knowledge and ability to fill culvert repairs. When the state of Ohio and the County fix culverts, they do not have issues with the gravel washing away and complaints of having to slow down so much because they are able to fix them properly so the road is flush. Every time he goes across, he imagines the amount of front-end damage, tire damage, bent rims etc. that is how bad those culverts have settled. He feels there is no reason for that to have been left like that.

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The dumpster on the new construction at Lester and 18 blocks the right away and makes it difficult to see oncoming traffic. Trustee Monroe has called about this. The sheriff looked at it and said he feels it is not so bad. Richard asked who is responsible and the sheriff dumped legal responsibility on the zoning inspector. Right of way blockage should be a sheriff call, but he felt they did not want to have to write a ticket. Dorothy will call the contractor to let them know if anyone is injured because of the dumpster placement, they could be held responsible.

Linda Wolstein – Can you explain the opt out procedure for trash service for the upcoming year? Trustee Zieja stated the Opt out process is January 1 – 31. It will start January 1 until 6% is met, or January 31, whichever is first. We will work on the process so ensure it will go smoother next year with better time stamp and process in place. Trustee Zieja hopes to have a letter out by October of this year detailing the process. The people who are on the list this year must opt out each year. Their spot on the list is not guaranteed year after year. She also wanted to know why Rumpke could not offer commercial dumpsters in the area. Why did a roofer get a dumpster in their yard, but their name does not appear on the opt out list? Trustee Zieja stated every time he calls Rumpke he gets a different answer to a procedural question and it is very frustrating. He wishes he had better answers, but he cannot get clear information himself. Dave Hull reminded everyone who has trash service that the bag option is cheaper. Trustee Pavlick stated the bag service is approximately \$19 per quarter. You must buy a roll of bags, but you do not have to place a bag weekly. Service can also be suspended for 3 months for vacation. Linda stated it has been so stressful all year dealing with this she now just has the payment automatically deducted, paying for two trash services because it is not worth her health to deal with this situation any longer.

Amy Missler – Do the dumpsters in the town have to be from Rumpke? No. If you need a dumpster, you can order them from anywhere.

Motion to Adjourn by Monroe, second by Pavlick. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Zieja, yes.





The Fiscal Officer advised the Board that the notice requirements of Section 121.22 of the Revised Code and the implementing rules adopted by the Board pursuant thereto were complied with for the meeting.

Trustee Monroe moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. #20-06-05

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO LEVY A TAX ABOVE THE TEN MILL LIMIT FOR PARKS AND RECREATIONAL PURPOSES, AND REQUESTING THE MEDINA COUNTY AUDITOR TO CERTIFY THE TOTAL CURRENT TAX VALUATION OF YORK TOWNSHIP, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO AND THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF REVENUE THAT WOULD BE GENERATED BY THAT RENEWAL LEVY PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 5705.03, 5705.19(H), 5705.191 and 5705.25.

WHEREAS, this Board finds that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of York Township and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of that limitation for parks and recreational purposes, in York Township, Medina County, Ohio, as authorized under Section 5705.19(H) of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Division (B) of Section 5705.03 of the Revised Code, in order to submit the question of a tax levy pursuant to Sections 5705.19(H), 5705.191 and/or 5705.25 of the Revised Code, this Board must request that the Medina County Auditor certify (i) the total current tax valuation of the Township and (ii) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the levy; and

WHEREAS, Division (B) of Section 5705.03 of the Revised Code requires this resolution to state the purpose of the tax, whether it is an additional levy or a renewal or a replacement of an existing tax or a renewal or replacement of an existing tax with an increase or decrease, the Section of the Revised Code authorizing its submission to the electors, the term of years for the tax or if it is a tax for a continuing period of time, the territory upon which the tax is to be levied, the date of the election at which the question of the tax shall appear on the ballot, the territory to which the ballot measure shall be submitted, the tax year in which the tax will first be levied and the calendar year in which the tax will first be collected, each county in which the subdivision

has territory and requesting such certification, the County Auditor is to certify the total current tax valuation of the District and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the proposed levy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of York Township, Medina County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. This Board declares that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of York Township and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation. The Board further declares:

- a. The purpose of said tax levy is for parks and recreational purposes.
- b. The tax shall be a renewal levy of an existing tax at a rate of five tenths (0.5) mills for each one-dollar of valuation which amounts to five (\$0.05) cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation for (5) years which levy is a renewal of an existing levy of (0.5) mills.
- c. The submission of the question of said renewal levy is authorized by Sections 5705.03, 5705.19(H), 5705.191, 5705.192, and/or 5705.25 of the Revised Code.
- d. The term of the tax shall be for five (5) years (see Section 5705.19(H)).
- e. The territory where the tax is to be levied shall be the entire territory of York Township, Medina County, Ohio.
- f. The date of the election at which the question of the tax shall appear on the ballot is November 3, 2020.
- g. The territory where the ballot measure is to be submitted is the entire territory of York Township, Medina County, Ohio.
- h. The tax year in which the tax will first be levied is 2021 and the calendar year in which the tax will first be collected is 2022.
- i. The Township has territory in Medina County and in no other county.

Section 2. This Board requests, in accordance with Section 5705.03(B) of the Revised Code, that the Medina County Auditor certify to this Board the following:

- a. The total current tax valuation of the Township, and
- b. The dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the renewal levy specified in Section 1.

Section 3. Pursuant to Section 5705.03(B)(1) the Township Fiscal Officer is authorized and directed to deliver promptly to the Medina County Auditor a certified copy of this Resolution.

Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board and of any of its committees concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board or committees, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Section 5. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its adoption.



A RESOLUTION PURSUANT TO HOUSE BILL 481 AFFIRMING COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS TO RECEIVE FUNDING FROM THE MEDINA COUNTY CORONAVIRUS RELIEF DISTRIBUTIONS AND DIRECTING THE FISCAL OFFICER TO ESTABLISH A SEPARATE ACCOUNT FOR SAID CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT FUNDS

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, 116 Public Law 136, (the CARES Act) was signed into law by the President of the United States on March 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly established a process for distributing funds provided by the "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act" in House Bill 481 of the 133rd General Assembly (SB 310); and

WHEREAS, HB 481 requires subdivisions receiving funds under Section 1 of the act, to pass a resolution affirming that funds from the County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund may be expended only to cover costs of the subdivision consistent with the requirements of section 5001 of the CARES Act as described in 42 U.S.C. 601(d), and any applicable regulations before receiving said funds; and

WHEREAS, York Township is requesting its share of funds from the Medina County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund.

A motion was made by Trustee Monw as follows:

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved

Section 1. That the Board of Trustees of York Township affirms that all funds received from the Medina County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund pursuant to HB 481 be expended only to cover costs of the Township consistent with the requirements of section 5001 of the CARES Act as described in 42 U.S.C. 601(d), and any applicable regulations and guidance only to cover expenses that:

- (1) Are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19);
- (2) Were not accounted for in York Township's most recently approved budget as of April 17, 2020; and
- (3) Were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020.

FURTHERMORE, in compliance with HB 481, be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of York Township that the York Township Fiscal Officer take all necessary action to:

- (1) On or before October 15, 2020, pay any unencumbered balance of money in the York Township's local coronavirus relief fund to the Medina County Treasurer;
- (2) On or before December 28, 2020, pay the balance of any money in the York Township's local coronavirus relief fund to the state treasury in the manner prescribed by the Director of the Ohio Office of Budget and Management; and

(3) Provide any information related to any payments received under HB 481 to the Director of the Ohio Office of Budget and Management as requested.

Section 2. That the Fiscal Officer of York Township is hereby directed to establish a separate account for said Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act funds.
