Chairman Colene Conley called the public hearing to order at 6:30pm and led the pledge of allegiance. Trustee Conley stated the hearing is being recorded for transcription purposes only.

Trustee Conley stated the purpose of the public hearing is for resolution number 23-02-01 amending section 205.01 Agricultural Uses and read the following.

WHEREAS Section 205.01 Agricultural Uses

CURRENTLY READS:

To the extent exempted under Ohio Revised Code Section 519.21, nothing contained in this Resolution shall prohibit the use of any land for agricultural purpose or the construction or use of buildings or structures incidental to the use of agricultural purposes of the land upon which said buildings or structures are located. No Zoning Certificate shall be required for such agricultural use, building or structure. The main farm dwelling and any accessory buildings used in connection with the dwelling, however, shall conform to the regulations contained in this Resolution.

AMEND TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

To the extent exempted under Ohio Revised Code Section 519.21, nothing contained in this Resolution shall prohibit the use of any land for agricultural purpose or the construction or use of buildings or structures incidental to the use of ~~of~~ *for* agricultural purposes of the land upon which said buildings or structures are located. No Zoning Certificate shall be required for such agricultural use, building or structure. *“However, the construction, installation and/or addition of an agricultural building or structure may be requested for the legal parcel owner to sign a statement confirming the building or structure will be used for agricultural purposes. If the approved agricultural building or structure is no longer used for agricultural purposes as stated in the Ohio Revised Code Section 519.21, the legal parcel owner is required to obtain a zoning certificate confirming compliance with the current Zoning Resolution.”* The main farm dwelling and any accessory buildings used in connection with the dwelling, however, shall conform to the regulations contained in this Resolution.

Trustee Conley asked if there were any questions. There were no questions.

FIRE DEPARTMENT – Deputy Chief Ken Barrett

Operations/Alarm Report (Incident Count Attached below)

- 30 incidents since the last Trustees Meeting.
- We gave mutual aid seven times and received none.
- One building fire was in Valley City, we sent an Engine Crew.

Administration

- We've applied for a TC Energy Community Grant for several Milwaukee Battery Tools, and we've applied for the FEMA AFG Grant for Turnout Gear.
- Recommend hiring Hope Sawyer. Hope is a Firefighter 2/EMT currently. She participates with Valley City and is looking to gain more experience as she prepares for paramedic school.

MOTION to hire Hope Sawyer as a Firefighter/EMT of the Erhart York Fire Department moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Conley, yes.

- Recommend hiring Ian Shirey. Ian is also a Firefighter 2/EMT and is in paramedic school currently. He also participates with Valley City also and is looking for opportunities for more hours and to broaden his exposure in the fire service.

MOTION to hire Ian Shirey as a Firefighter/EMT of the Erhart York Fire Department moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Conley, yes.

- Hope and Ian are two more members (out of 5) whose salaries will be covered and/or supplemented, through December of 2024, by the \$108,000 Ohio EMA ARPA grant we received.
- We seek approval for approximately \$11,500 in uniforms and uniform alterations from Levinson's Uniforms. Captain Sparks has been working feverishly this first quarter to update uniforms across the department. We are two years behind on uniforms. This year's amount is higher than normal to account for the catch up.

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MOTION to approve \$11,500 for uniforms and uniform alterations moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Conley, yes.

Fleet/ Station/ Maintenance

- Annual station generator maintenance completed.
- Ladder 56-1 will be gone soon, Fallsway Equipment has received all the parts to make needed repairs to the compartment door and the truck will go to the Career Center immediately after that. Fiscal Officer Peggy Russell stated that the truck is off the OTARMA insurance policy as of 2/1/23. Wendy suggested leaving it as is since we have a 30-day grace period associated with the truck. If an incident happens, we can add it back on. I also let her know we will be adding a 2023 Chevrolet Silverado 2500 HD Pickup truck in the next couple weeks.
- We are requesting approval to purchase a 2023 Chevy 2500 Crew Cab Pickup from Serpentine of Medina. This is the 2023 state bid truck and is about \$17,000 less than the state bid price. Those state bid prices were set in October of 2022 and due to the market and supply vs demand are easily beaten today. The price of the truck is \$52,835. This truck would be used as a utility response truck and supplement the suburban (56-2) that is 23 years old. More frequently we have members participating in meetings, trainings, and all hazards team call outs throughout the county. A second support vehicle will make the suburban available for those events without altering our response. All in I see this being about a \$75,000 project for the truck, accessories, emergency lights, and striping/ lettering.

MOTION to purchase a 2023 Chevrolet Silverado 2500 HD pickup truck from Serpentine of Medina, out of Fund 2901 for \$52,835.00 pending prosecutor approval, moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Conley, yes.

MOTION to approve to purchase a truck cap and sliding cargo bed from A Better Truck Cap and Hitch for \$5,345.00 from Fund 2901 moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Conley, yes.

MOTION to Approve additional outfitting for 2023 Chevrolet Silverado 2500 HD Pick up Truck to include Accessories, Lettering, Emergency Lights paid from Fund 2901 not to exceed \$23,000.00 **moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick. Roll: Monroe, yes; Pavlick, yes; Conley, yes.**

- We've completed 172 hours of training in the last month. Department training topics for the month consisted of Patient Refusals, Fire Suppression Systems, St. Martin Walk-through with Valley City, Airway Skills and SCBA Confidence.

- On February 6th at training a member of our department had a major medical event and was transported to the hospital. I am happy to report that the same week the member was

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discharged to go home and is doing great and is even returning to work soon. Chief Creamer wants to thank and commend all members of our department, Medina Emergency Room, and Cleveland Clinic Main Campus who provided excellent care.

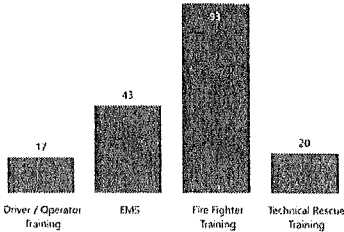

ZONING – Stephan Ibos, Zoning Inspector

General Items

- Census 2023 Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS) – Completed
 - In the process of completing the verification I found one small stretch of parcels on Smith Road that are part of the City/Township Joint ownership. They were marked this way on the Census data and on the County Auditor Site but do not show that way on the latest (2014) township maps. I verified this with the county. If we want to order new maps, I have a few names at the county and I can work with them on new maps. Trustee Conley stated to wait on getting new maps until the Comprehensive Plan is completed.
- Locking Trash Bins at Park, Town Hall, and Cemetery have been delivered and signage is posted on them.
- Wolff Bros Supply Inc. – Retention Basin
 - Contacted Mr. Wolff this week, they have a revised plan that is being looked at by the county to rework the front detention basin to hold less than 1.5’ of water. Plans are being worked between County and Rolling and Hocevar (Campbell Construction Contractor) for revised plan, last update on 2/10/23 is they are working on plans to be formally stamped for approval.

Permitting

- Numbers currently to date:
 - Total of 5 permits issued this year
 - I have 1 permit outstanding
 - 6078 Wolff Rd - Wolff Bros. Generator – passed through both BZA and ZC, no zoning permit required.
 - 6078 Wolff Rd – Wolff Bros Supply Inc Building expansion – approved by BZA & approved by Zoning Commission with conditions (lean-to needs to be fully enclosed), waiting on application now for permit.
- Enclave at Woodside Preserve – no updates

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- Emerald Run Extension – no updates
 - Last drive through there was still no concrete laid for new street.

Training

- January 26 and 27– OTA Winter Conference in Columbus – I put together my notes from the meeting and would be happy to send those out to anyone that is interested.
- February 16 – Zoning Training at York Township Office – thanked Trustee Conley for putting that together, it was very beneficial. I distributed a soft copy of the presentation that was used during the training.
- February 16 – Coordinated Response Exercise Pipeline Safety Program (CoRE), did not attend due to Zoning Training
- February 23 10:00 am – Storm Water Phase II training, attended and sent meeting notes to Trustees
- April 1 – Ohio Agritourism Conference, not planning to attend due to distance and the cost

BZA (February Meeting)

- Minutes were approved, included BZA hearing on Wolff Brothers Supply
- Provided an update on new Comprehensive Plan

Zoning Commission

- New Comprehensive plan
 - Met with Zoning Commission on February 2, 2023, George Smerigan said we are in good shape with what we had on the last plan, just need to add some updates.
 - Zoning Commission will meet on March 2, 2023 to update pages 2 and 26-32 which covers the goals of the Township within the Comprehensive Plan as well as facilities, services, and land use.
 - Will meet again with George Smerigan April 6, 2023, to review updates and proposed changes.
 - Target would be to get a draft copy of the plan in front of the residents in the April/May time frame for feedback. If the Zoning Commission needs additional time from the March 2nd meeting a special meeting will be set up later that month and a notice of a public meeting will be posted.

- We need additional Key fobs for the security system but will hold off for now until we decide if we will replace or upgrade the current system.

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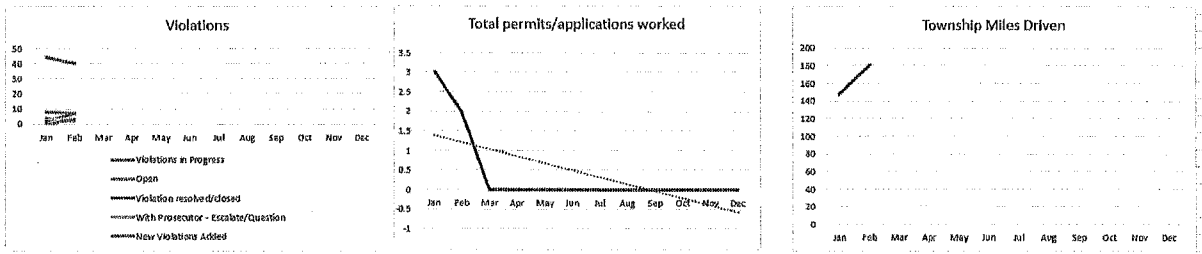

TOWN HALL/CEMETERY – Theresa Forlini-Petrey
Townhall

- Thanked Steve for all the work he’s done in the Town Hall, changing out the paper towel holders, installing changing tables, lights, etc.
- We have voting coming up the first week of May
- Windows – would like to see if we can schedule for the townhall windows to be cleaned like last year. We have the supplies to do this in-house.

Cemetery

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- **REPAIR: Plot B48 #4** – the footer is sinking a bit, could use a bit of dirt around the headstone – photo and map attached.
- **Fence line** – can we work on getting this on the schedule to be fixed? Trustee Pavlick stated that the township will have someone to do this soon.
- **Spring clean-up**
 - March is approaching for spring clean-up in the cemeteries.
 - We have updated cemetery policies on the website. Kristy placed a nice reminder on our digital sign and will add something on the website next week.
 - Previously we had someone that would clean up the cemetery – what is the direction this year? I am more than happy to help since the policies have changed a bit. Trustee Pavlick said we will have someone to do this soon.
- We are looking for a company that can dig footers for us.
- Footer Rates - since prices are rising do we want to look at adjusting our footer prices?
 - Current:

Two foot	\$300
Three foot	\$400
Four foot	\$500
Above four foot	Price determined by size
Removal of footer & re-reposition of headstone	– Price determined by size.
 - Trustee Monroe recommended to raise footer prices by \$100 each due to increased concrete and labor costs, two foot now \$400, three foot now \$500, four foot now \$600, above four foot and removal of footer and reposition of headstone still determined by size. All trustees agreed. Down the road we need to look at adjusting other prices as well.

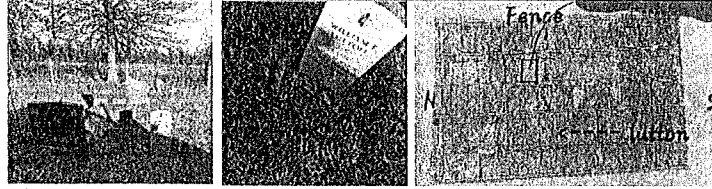
- Have been in contact with Medina County Veterans Services, flags are on order for Memorial Day to be placed on Veteran's graves.
- Flags needed around the township – cost needs Trustee approval.

- There was discussion regarding the flags on the utility poles around town which we have brackets and put flags up on, which may not be allowed any longer. Trustee Monroe and Theresa will look into it.

Gold Star Memorial Pavers

- Working through old notes, emails, and information; requests date back a few years
- Received current pricing from Linda Rooks at Midwest Engraving and she verified the 4 paver colors used previously and I will pick up a sample of each of the 4 colors to have on hand. Regimental Red was used for KIA only, are there specific uses for any of the other colors?
- Waiting for information from Milano Monuments regarding black polished pavers. Is there anywhere else we can source for these?
- Contacted Woody Williams Foundation regarding a local contact since Mickey Kennedy passed away, still waiting for a return call.
- Per previous discussion with Trustee Monroe, Sherman will install pavers at no charge.
- Copy of the old order form and the new one given to Trustees, will need to determine the price for each paver option. Will we set up the installation of pavers in the Spring and Fall?
- Trustee Conley asked if there is a setup charge for each order we submit. Not sure so will find out.

Misc.

- POW/MIA flag is getting tattered, will reach out to Ed from Rolling Thunder to see if they can provide a new one, and Theresa will check on the price to order one from Falls Flag. Modified the motion for approval of flags purchase from \$1,150 to \$1,350 to cover the addition of a POW/MIA flag.
- Ed from Rolling Thunder dropped off a flyer today for their annual Chili Cookoff which will be March 19, 2023 and is open to the public. Trustees approved adding the information to the electronic sign as we have done for many years.

TRUSTEES

TRUSTEE PAVLICK

- Tom Croston who previously did our roadside mowing has retired. Trustee Conley reached out to Trustee Ron Bischof of Montville Township on the shared use of Tom's mower. They have approved shared use and we will coordinate with Chris Kosman on expectations, maintenance, etc. We will be able to do roadside mowing and other township property mowing in house.

MOTION to approve the purchase of a Scag Turf Tiger with 2-year guarantee, it is a gas mower with a shaft drive, 40HP Briggs & Stratton engine, with 61" deck from Wellington

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Implement for the state bid price of \$13,883 moved by Trustee Pavlick, second by Trustee Monroe. Roll: Pavlick, yes; Monroe, yes; Conley, yes.

The township will also need to look into purchase of some form of storage tank for gas.**TRUSTEE CONLEY**

- Was graciously elected Secretary/Treasurer for Medina County Township Trustee Association. Will be keeping books, take reservations for dinners and the annual steak potluck cookout.
- Met with Southwest Landscaping wrote a letter granting the township permission to cancel the contract, but would like the opportunity to enter into a new contract of the in-house maintenance does not work out to our satisfaction..
- OTA Memberships are \$50 for employees. Kristy, Theresa, and Steve already have memberships. Board of Zoning Appeals and Zoning Commission will also be eligible for OTA Membership We can revisit how many would benefit from membership closer to June when the new membership drive starts.
- Regarding the plans for the area by the curve on Route 18/Norwalk near Fenn, Trustee Monroe has been having difficulty getting ahold of the Medina County Park Director for an update. He will reach out again.

TRUSTEE MONROE

- The key fob system at the complex is not supported anymore as it has been discontinued. If there are any problems with it, we are unable to get replacement parts and will have to replace the entire system.
- Attended the OTA Winter Conference at the end of January, was worthwhile to go and always learn something new.
- We applied for the MORE Grant and received \$500.
- Jesse has been working on berming on Spieth, and still has more to do.
- Has contacted ODOT in regard to drainage on the roundabout at Columbia and Spieth, and Lester by 57 is not draining very well. He has left messages for the project manager and will continue to call and email.
- Received a call from a contractor who is building a house on Branch asking about ditching in front of the house. We are not ditching, and the contractor was told they will need to handle it.
- New stop signs installed at Columbia and Smith.
- Attended a pipeline training, it was good and very useful training.
- Final attachments came in for the front-end loader, we need to figure out indoor building space for equipment.
- Road bids are in for paving of Branch and Stone; we are going with Melway Paving's bid of \$940,501.15. There were a total of 6 bidders, which included Melway, Karvo, Kokosing, Perrin, Chagrin Valley and Cross Roads. Due to the project being big, we need to have a construction management company to oversee the project, will reach out to 2 companies to see about making arrangements and gathering cost information. There

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are 9 culverts that need to be replaced before the paving work begins, there are a few that are decent sized.

RESOLUTION #23-02-02 MOTION to approve Melway Paving as lowest and best bid for Branch and Stone Road Paving Project at \$940,501.15 for approximately 6.5 miles of road, pending prosecutor approval of contract (the engineer's estimate was \$1,152,362.50). Money to be paid from the following funds: Fund 2021 for \$150K, Fund 2031 for \$350K, Fund 2231 for \$50K, ARPA Fund 2273 for \$223,100.85, and the approximate balance up to \$200K from the General Fund. Moved by Trustee Monroe, second by Trustee Pavlick.

- Salt Barn – we need to make a decision on if we will order salt this year or if we will use it again for keeping equipment undercover, though equipment should be in a heated building. We will need to think about this.

FISCAL OFFICER

- Ohio has agreed to participate in five new proposed National Opioid Settlements (“New National Opioid Settlements”) with Teva, Allergan, CVS, Walgreens, and Walmart. The Medina County Prosecutor has been designated as the authorized signer for all Medina County Townships. Our office recommends approval of these Settlements. The higher the rate of subdivision approval of these Settlement results in a higher payout to the State of Ohio and its subdivisions, so it is important to formalize your approval by resolution. We have prepared the attached Resolution for approval of these Settlements by your Township. Once this Resolution is approved, please scan and return it to me to confirm our office has the authority to sign the five participation forms on your behalf. Please consider approval of this Resolution at the Board's next opportunity to be sure we can indicate your Township's approval prior to a mid-April deadline.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- **Melissa Bevier Clifford, Litchfield resident** – as an active member of the Litchfield community, poll worker and Buckeye alumni. She attended representing a new group “Advocates for Buckeye Community” in regard to the proposed school levy coming up on the May ballot. She stated that for the first time in 23 years the school is coming to us asking for a large amount for renovations and new buildings. It’s time to address the Jr. High (66 years old, new wing is 22 years) and High School (50 years old, some parts being 43 years old and some 20ish years old). The proposal is to build one new combined Jr. High and High School in a new location near the intersection of Columbia and Wolff, then existing buildings would be demolished. This is an \$80 million bond which will be a \$120 million burden on taxpayers and will cost about \$200 per \$100,000 property valuation per year for possibly over 30 years. The group has a Facebook page “The Buck Stops Here”, and she had voter guides available at the meeting.

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- **Nadine Davis, Columbia Rd.** – Questions and a complaint on Rumpke opt-out, the letter the township sent said “submitting in person” she attended and saw other residents turning in forms for more than one person. She wants to know what the process is for signing someone up. Trustee Pavlick said that in the past it has always been allowed. Why isn’t it identified on the paper so that everyone has that opportunity, how many can someone sign up? Trustee Pavlick stated there is no limit per person specified. What is that 6% number that is allowed? Right around 1600 residences allowing for 100 opt outs. Trustee Conley asked how she would do it? She felt disadvantaged because she left work to come in and then saw others turning in several forms and she did not make it in the first 100. Discussion continued on future contract possibilities eliminating the opt-out, and current lower cost service options. Trustee Conley asked what she would like us to do. She would like to see added to next year’s letter that forms can be dropped off by someone other than the property resident. Trustee Conley stated that is easy to do and she agrees with her.
- **Richard Hill** – attended a recent Liverpool Township Trustee meeting on Tuesday in which the gentleman who recently had a devastating house fire in Valley City was also at and spoke during public comment. The resident was displeased with the way it went from the time of the call until it was over. Deputy Chief Barrett stated to clarify, EYFD was not on the call. There were 6 departments on the call, and what bothered him the most were the pictures of his home and personal information that were shared on social media by attending fire department members. He just wanted to bring awareness.
- **Mickey Ballantyne, Wolff Rd.** – lives across the street from Wolff Bros. What is the plan with the generator? Steve Ibos stated it will be in the back of where the solar panels are and will be in a noise reducing container in the northeast corner of the parking area and there are plans for a staggered tree line to be installed. The water issue was addressed, Steve again said they are reworking the retention plan to hold less than 1.5’ of water. Wolff Road needs to be cleaned every day from the construction vehicles and it’s not getting done, the large construction vehicles are still on the road, is there a weight limit allowed on Wolff? Trustee Monroe stated that Ohio State Highway Patrol and Medina County Sheriff have both been called. Steve Ibos said he will follow up with them again. The vehicles caused a ditch to collapse to the west of his house, at an elderly neighbor’s home; Steve will take a look at that as well and Trustee Pavlick will contact Wolff Bros too. He also voiced concern over the whole project and its effect on his property value, Trustee Pavlick recommended calling the Medina County Auditor to ask for his property value to be adjusted.
- **Norm Hinman** – had heard about 6 months ago that the cemetery was out of lots? Trustees stated this is not true, there are many plots available. Zoning question, at the end of Beck at Norwalk, on the NW side of the road there are 2 new barns going up, did they get zoning permits for these? Steve Ibos stated the barns are built as Agricultural Exempt. Opt-out complaint, he stated he also does not like that multiple forms can be dropped off by one person for trash opt-out. He has the medical form for trash service where they will come part way to the house to get the cans. Rumpke has not been dumping his garbage can when they pick it up, they just take the bags out and walk them back to the truck leaving any loose garbage in the can. Beck and Stone, hole in the road

needs attention. Does not feel a township trustee meeting is an appropriate place to bring up or discuss the school bond issues.

No, it was postponed, Theresa hopes to be able to contact the company we are working with to discuss available times and get it scheduled soon. Trustee Conley asked Theresa to email schedule to her so she can call the door company.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of York Township, Medina County, Ohio, that:

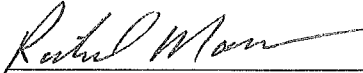
